



KK: To be honest, this part wasn't popular at all.


Fred: Yes, I wouldn't recommend you do that again.

# Victoria Cup rubbish



Our children develop all the essential academic and social skills, becoming proficient in both English and Cantonese, and often going on to study at prestigious universities.

### 4. Corporate sponsor tickets

AA opined that this would be very difficult to do because tickets had already been issued. He also pointed out that only 12% of tickets went to corporate sponsors.

SJ proposed a condition of punctuality. He specified that corporate sponsor ticketholders should lose their ticket if they had not arrived within 60 minutes of the start of play.

All agreed that this measure would be harsh but fair.

#### 5. Fanzone

SJ provided an update on the Fanzone preparations. She reported that she had contacted the All England Lawn Tennis Club regarding their use of the Fanzone and ticket system there. SJ proposed adopting the same system at the 2021 Victoria Cup so that even more real fans can attend. The meeting unanimously accepted the proposal.

# Letter to the Editor of the Hong Kong Press & Journal from Ms. Geeta Singh

I am writing in regard to your article about the 2021 Victoria Cup which appeared in your newspaper on 21 April as I am keen for the organisers to avoid the mistakes they made last year regarding ticketing. First of all, last year, I was annoyed to find that the majority of the seats were reserved for corporate sponsors and their guests. As well as being unfair, I can also testify that a good number of these corporate sponsor seats are invariably left empty because they don't show up.

Another issue last year was that us real fans could not get a hold of tickets whilst the people who actually got the tickets weren't even real tennis fans. Ironically, it is exactly these people who end up talking through the matches and putting players off. I would like to know what Events Horizon intends to do about this type of spectator this year. We can't go on like previous years when the stewards have been too scared to say anything.

For the benefit of the Hong Kong public and for the health of the sport in general, I urge Events Horizon to address these issues.

In Hong Kong we have a Fanzone in Victoria Park, where fans can catch the action on the large screen, but to be honest it hasn't been a success. Last year there were really barely any fans there.

Leon: Right, well, at Wimbledon, we've found that the trick is to, you know, assure the fans that if they turn up on the day, they'll have a chance to get a seat. You'd be surprised how many no-shows we get. Honestly, especially from the corporate sponsors. There's no reason to waste a good seat, that's what we say. So we give those tickets away to fans.

Sana: Wow. That sounds very good and everything but surely it causes a stampede!

Leon: Not quite! I mean, as the fans enter, I suppose you could say what is the equivalent of your "Fanzone" at Wimbledon, they're given a ticket number as they come in. Our staff keep track of any seats that are not claimed and release them to the fans that have the lowest ticket numbers once it's confirmed that the seats won't be occupied.

Sana: Right, well thanks for the info. The use of the Fanzone's an agenda item at our next committee meeting, so what you've just told will be useful for our discussion. I'm sure it'll help.

Leon: No problem. Good luck and do let me know how it goes.

# Exclusive: Sponsor Joins Chorus of Criticism of Victoria Cup Advertising Campaign

Our reporter understands that Sportrite are considering withdrawing their corporate sponsorship of the Victoria Cup following a controversial poster campaign promoting the event. The poster in question featured an image of Suzie Gilmour, ranked number 80 in the world, posing according to one insider, "like an amateur model". A spokesman for the company, Tim Lewis, revealed that the sponsors had made their expectations very clear to organisers Events Horizon:
